


Annual Report July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

One of seven persons in South Dakota (or over 100,000 people) live at or below the poverty level according to Community Food Banks of South Dakota. About one-half of these people are children and infants. A primary food shortage is fresh meat, which is in high demand and difficult to obtain. Of particular demand is game meat because of its nutritional value in having low fat and high protein content.





the increase in need. In 2008, 2,203 antlerless deer and 374 for doe/fawn antelope were donated through SDSAH for a total of 90,000 pounds of meat. Hunters also donated 257 buck deer and 20 buck antelope. Additionally, 3,066 pheasants were donated to SDSAH through commercial pheasant businesses. Processed game meat was distributed to needy families across the state by over 65 food pantries and other charitable organizations/agencies.

You can help SDSAH by supporting and participating in one or more of three SDSAH programs.

 SDSAH pays for processing of antlerless deer and doe/fawn antelope donated to SDSAH at participating meat processors.

Unused game meat is collected from hunters at collection points where it is inspected and picked up by food banks.

➢ Donation of Commercially Processed Game Animals.

Hunters can pay full processing costs for the game animal and donate the meat to SDSAH.

All meat collected by processors and food banks is distributed to the most needy individuals in their areas.
