MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

By now some of you have seen the most recent study announcing that one out of every 8 individuals in South Dakota live at or below the poverty line and 11.2%, or 92,200 South Dakotans are food insecure. More alarming statistics from this study show that nearly 19.6% of South Dakota's children under the age of 18 struggles with hunger and that 8 of the poorest counties in the country are found in South Dakota.

In normal times, increases in donations of food and funds could be expected to help ease this problem. However, we are not in normal economic times. Although the recession hasn't hit South Dakota as hard as other states in the country, the national recession and high unemployment assures that high demand for food assistance will persist at a time when economic hardships will create problems with availability of commodities and funding of federal food assistance programs.



According to Feeding America, meat protein is the hardest food item to obtain, due to its high cost. South Dakota Sportsmen Against Hunger (SAH) has partnered with Feeding South Dakota and other charitable food distributors in the state to help provide meat protein to thousands of South Dakotans each year. We are proud to announce that over 100,000 pounds of ground venison, commercially processed game meat and donated pheasants were provided to needy South Dakotans through the efforts of SAH last year.

We cannot accomplish these goals alone and are deeply appreciative of those sportsmen who donate animals each year and donors who contribute funds to support the costs of our programs. We also want to recognize and thank our many cooperating food processors who often process animals for SAH at a reduced cost.

But now is not the time to rest on our success. We are looking at ways to expand our programs to collect other game animals. SAH, Game, Fish and Parks and the US Fish and Wildlife Service have been working on an agreement allowing Canada geese harvested during the upcoming August Management Take to be donated to SAH.

We will aspire to do better in the coming year, but we can't accomplish that without your help. We need help to expand our programs and the amount of meat distributed. Please consider purchasing additional deer tags and donating those harvested animals to SAH at one of our cooperating processing facilities. It will help the hungry and will benefit farmers and ranchers who have surplus animals on their lands. Your actions may even earn you an invitation to come back and hunt on a landowner's property in the future.

Thanks to all who donated this past year. Have a safe and successful hunting season, and don't forget about SAH!
