

# Annual Report July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012

#### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**

In the past year, SD Sportsmen Against Hunger continued to promote donation of harvested wild game animals to the needy. SAH donations totaled 78,735 pounds of meat that provided 314,940 meals in 2011. Most meat came from donations of animals harvested during the 2011 deer seasons; however we also took in pheasant, elk, grouse and Canada geese meat last year, not to mention our clean out your freezer food drives which took in 2,775 pound of healthy game meat. Overall, this is a drop from the record donations last year. However our programs are getting stronger every year as hunters and charitable organizations continue to become familiar with our programs and rally around our efforts.

The reduction in meat donations last year was a direct result of lower deer and antelope numbers in many areas of the state and as I write this, our state continues to be caught firmly in the grip of one of the worst droughts in decades. Additionally, we have suffered losses in deer numbers due to disease. These effects will not only have negative impacts on this year's deer harvest and donations to SAH, but will also likely effect harvest in 2013.

With deer numbers down, SAH has been working hard on promoting and arranging for donations of other sources of game meat that are plentiful right now. New to the program last year were the Canada goose donations from the August Management Take season, and for 2012, with cooperation from the US Fish and Wildlife Service we have expanded to also accept birds from the Early Canada Goose Season. Our hope is that we can eventually get permission to accept donations from the regular goose season as well.

I would like to call special attention to a couple of big donors this year. The SD Department of Game, Fish and Parks and Wal-Mart continue to be longtime supporters of our program, as well as the Greater Dacotah Chapter of SCI, First Premier Bank, the Elmen Foundation and Scheels. We could not be more grateful for their huge support.

A new supporter to SAH this past year was First Interstate Bank. Each fall FIB promotes a Neighbors Feeding Neighbors campaign for their employees and directors. The campaign promotes giving to nonprofit organizations with a mission of feeding those less fortunate. Through this campaign, FIB employees, along with matching funds from First Interstate Bancsystem Foundation contributed \$6,910 to SAH. This was the largest contribution in South Dakota for the 2011 Neighbors Feeding Neighbors campaign.

Many people and organizations contribute to the continuing success of SAH. Our heartfelt thanks to sportsmen who harvest and donate game animals, private donors and organizations who help with funding, participating meat processors who generally reduce their fees for the processing the donated game, SAH volunteers, and pantries who accept and distribute the donated game meat. A big "Thank You" to all for another great year for SAH!
