MESSAGE FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

South Dakota Sportsmen Against Hunger (SDSAH) was founded in 1992 following a format established by Safari Club International (SCI). There was no SCI chapter in South Dakota at that time so Black Hills Sportsmen Club became the sponsoring organization. From a small, local program that provided 1,500 pounds of donated game meat to local food pantries the first year, SDSAH has grown into the most successful Sportsmen Against Hunger chapter in the United States! In 2010, South Dakota game meat donations were 25% of the total SAH game meat donations for the entire nation!

This incredible success has been possible because of a strong partnership with South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks (GFP), generous game and cash donations by sportsmen and women, funding assistance from several South Dakota organizations as well excellent cooperation from the Feeding South Dakota Food Bank System and most of the wild game processors in South Dakota.

Since 2010, there has been a gradual decrease in the total amount of game meat donated from over 100,000 to 66,000 pounds. This is primarily due to the reduction in antlerless deer and antelope tags. However, that decline has been mitigated somewhat by the addition of donation programs for Canada geese, pheasants and even walleyes.

On behalf of the South Dakota Sportsmen Against Hunger Board of Directors I want to thank our loyal corporate donors (listed elsewhere in this report), the individual sportsmen and women who donate via the GFP check-off and/or donate their game, our many processors, and GFP for making this program so successful.

Even though our program has achieved great results, South Dakotan's still have trouble meeting their nutritional needs, and fresh meat is expensive and particularly difficult to obtain. Despite our efforts, the demand for meat from needy individuals is not being met.

We encourage you to continue to support the Sportsmen Against Hunger program by:

- ❖ Donating Canada geese, antlerless deer and doe/fawn antelope through the processing certificate program
- ❖ Donating all or a portion of other game animals and paying for the processing
- ❖ Donating unused, processed game meat and other meat during "clean out your freezer food drives"
- ❖ Continuing your generous donations through the GFP check-off program

With deer and antelope numbers down the last few years, donations of game animals have fallen in lockstep with these population trends. We hope you consider and plan for donating one or more of your harvested deer and antelope to our program in 2013. Those who receive this meat from the pantries are very grateful.

Have a successful and safe hunting season!
