

Annual Report July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In 2009, we saw South Dakota's Sportsmen Against Hunger program reach a milestone in their efforts to assist in the fight against hunger. With the 88,830 pounds of ground venison along with the nearly 6,000 pheasants, hunters and processors provided over 97,750 pounds of valuable protein to Feeding South Dakota and many area emergency feeding programs.

As the effects of the economic downturn continued to impact South Dakota families we saw an increase in the numbers of families being forced to ask for assistance. This demand placed an enormous strain on our food inventory and at times made it very difficult for us to meet all the hunger needs. We were especially challenged in our ability to ensure families were provided some kind of good protein products. As you well know, protein is such an important part in the daily dietary needs of an individual and yet it is one of the most difficult food items for us to get donated. However, the contributions made by supporters



of Sportsmen Against Hunger helped provide enough meat to help in the making of over 391,000 meals for so many of those families in need.

The partnership between Feeding South Dakota and Sportsmen Against Hunger has truly made a difference in so many lives. From the children to the seniors, the unemployed to the under-employed, there are so many of our fellow South Dakotans who struggle to get a good meal each and every day. But through the generosity of sportsmen and women, tens of thousands of people have been blessed with not only the gift of food, but have also been provided a bit of hope. It is on behalf of all these individuals and families whose lives have benefited from this wonderful program that I say thank you to those who have contributed to the Sportsmen Against Hunger program. Know that your efforts have made a real difference, and that all those who have supported this program are truly "heroes to the hungry".

I wish to express my sincere gratitude for the assistance of the Sportsmen Against Hunger, and the donation of several hundred pounds of venison in 2009.

Tree of Life Ministry is a Relief Agency and has one of the largest Food Pantries that serves two Lakota Reservations. Todd County, which is the Rosebud Reservation, is the 4th poorest county in the entire USA, with a population of over 10,000 people, while Buffalo County, the Crow Creek Reservation with a population of 2,150 is the poorest. Our "Warm Welcome" is open 4 days a week and averages 162 families a day that come for food and clothing. Thus, being open 200 days each year, at an average of 162 families per day. We deliver 32,400 packages of food per year to impoverished families.

In addition, we also used some of your venison for our hot meal program that feeds an average of 175 people per day. That is approximately 35,000 meals per year. Your donation of game meat is greatly appreciated and used to help control the costs of these programs.

On behalf of the staff of Tree of Life, and all those who are recipients of the donated game, I extend my thanks. I look forward to participating in your program again this year.

Sportsmen Against Hunger

I am the director of the Custer Food Pantry in Custer, South Dakota. Our Pantry began benefiting from the SDSAH program three years ago when Jeff Prior of Guys With Knives (local processor and really great guy) enthusiastically promoted the program. The Pantry has been receiving over 3,000 pounds of game meat each year. We have come to depend on this greatly. We have seen a 40% increase of Pantry use over the last two years. When you consider that ground beef will cost us about \$3 a pounds this is a donation of over \$9,000. Incredible!

I have read literature about eating locally. In the Black Hills we are limited in what we are able to grow in our gardens. But, the local venison supply has been substantial.

I have also been able to personally thank hunters for donating their deer to us. This includes young hunters not only establishing a hunting tradition with their families but a giving tradition in the community as well.

This has been a win-win program. Thank you so much for conceiving of and implementing such a great program.
